The renowned veterinarians of the city, Dr Amandeep Kaur Mauj and Dr Jaspreet Singh Mauj were the guest of honour . Dr Amandeep Kaur , Masters in Veterinary Science is working with Government of Punjab as a Veterinary Officer. Dr Amandeep is a dog lover and works for stray dogs as well.
