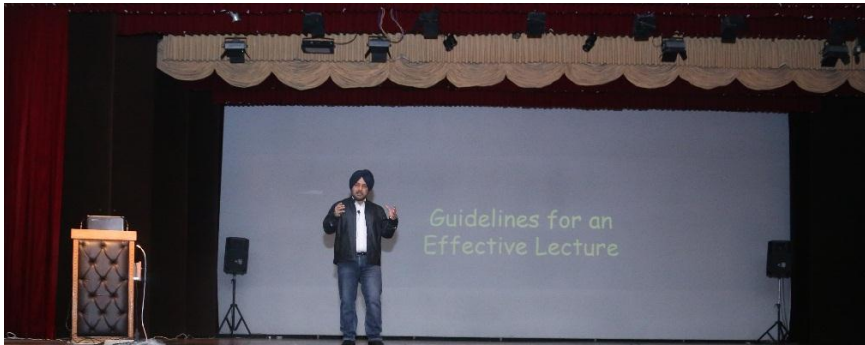


“Teachers should be dangerously optimistic”- Effective lecture by Dr. Rajoo Singh Chhina at Sat Paul Mittal School



Dr. Rajoo Singh Chhina, Dean Academics at DMCH, and a member of National Board of Education, facilitated an interactive session ‘Guidelines for Effective Lecture’ with the teaching staff of Sat

Paul Mittal School. Dr. Chhina began by sharing guidelines for the educators that expertise, engagement, enthusiasm and the ability to evoke interest is what makes a lecture interesting.

The faculty was advised to demonstrate novelty and ingenuity for adding value to the student-teacher relationship. He further elaborated that although, Indian education system has stood the test of time yet the future of education is steadily moving towards cloud computing, virtual labs, 3D & 4D printing and flexibility in class sizes, etc.

Teachers were reminded that along with utility, the creativity quotient needs to be constantly reignited. Dr. Chhina envisions the Indian education’s testing mechanism to become more skills based in the coming years. The lecture was interspersed with humorous anecdotes to keep the interest alive in the audience. He left the teachers with a note that “teachers should be dangerously optimistic” and “anything done at community level is better than efforts put for personal glorification.”
