Essay Competition held among more than 11000 participants*



Satyan Snehal Jindal, a class XII student of Sat Paul Mittal School has achieved the Silver Award in The Queen's Commonwealth Essay Competition. The Queen's Commonwealth Essay Competition is the world's oldest schools' international level writing competition, managed by the Royal Commonwealth Society since 1883. Every year, it offers all Commonwealth youth aged 18 and under, the opportunity to express their hopes for the future, opinions of the present, and thoughts on the past, through the written word.

In 2019, more than 11,000 young people from more than 20 commonwealth countries entered the competition. Satyan Snehal Jindal participated in the senior category and submitted his entry on the topic 'We are all now connected by the internet. What does the future hold for mankind?' Out of more than 11000 participants, less than one third were awarded the 'award for excellence in writing' in gold, silver or bronze category. Snehal's writing skills, as well as his philosophical take on the topic, helped him earn the 'Silver Award' for the year 2019. He is honoured to be a second time winner in the competition after winning the 'Bronze Award' in 2018 and hopes to continue to make the school proud by making the most out of such opportunities in the future.
