Advice: Eat a LOTTT today!!!

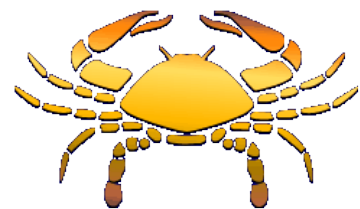


Capricorn (The Goat): Look out for blue...make your presence felt, send chits often and raise motions.

Advice: Do care to go the extra mile.



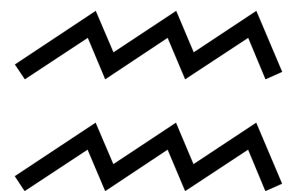
Pisces (The Fishes): You might turn aggressive very soon. Do not let someone see your anger and stay calm. Enjoying the sessions will help you.

THE UNITED NATIONS SECURITY COUNCIL

This committee means business. Without a single hiccup the committee began formal session and just after sitting through the first fifteen minutes it can be safely said this is going to a very serious three day conference.

The General Speaker's list was smooth sailing with the delegate of Nigeria immediately appealing to the delegates not to play a blame-game, thus, making it easier for themselves to avoid the tough questions that would be directed at their government.
